

<u>Relationship with God:</u>	
	Recognize Law and Gospel.
	Identify grace as the motivation for good works.
	Compare and contrast Luther's views and the teachings of the 16th-century church.
	Acknowledge Holy Scripture as the final authority for both doctrine and practice.
	Define worship.
	Acknowledge Jesus as the Messiah, the Christ who fulfilled Old Testament prophecies.
	Recognize that through the means of grace, the Holy Spirit leads people to identify and trust in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.
	Daily remember the covenant God made with them in Baptism.
	Express confident trust in God to help them overcome the temptations they face.
<u>Relationship with others:</u>	
	Acknowledge that through His suffering and death, Jesus earned forgiveness of sin and eternal life for them and for all people.
	Rely on the Holy Spirit's power to share God's love and forgiveness with all others.
<u>Relationship with the world:</u>	
	Recognize signs of God's love and care in their own lives.
	Identify opportunities in which God can use them in service to Him.
	Trust that God will accomplish His good purposes even in times of conflict and crisis.
